# KEEPING NURSES HEALTHY

## **THE ISSUE**

- Each year, 30,000-38,000 nurses or nursing assistants are away from work due to work related musculoskeletal disorders
- When nurses lift or reposition patients, it can lead to serious injuries in the back, shoulder, neck or wrists causing pain or disability
- Keeping nurses healthy and safe on the job is imperative to providing quality care to patients

## THE RESEARCH

 National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) supported research at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF) School of Nursing on the significant roles of policies and practices to promote safe patient handling and make hospital work environments safer for nurses so they can prevent injuries and stay on the job

# WHAT HELPS IMPROVE NURSES' SAFETY?

 Dr. Soo-Jeong Lee's work found that California's safe patient handling legislation reduced the risk of musculoskeletal injuries among healthcare workers

### WHAT PLAYS A ROLE IN IMPROVING NURSES' SAFETY?

Dr. Soo-Jeong Lee's research also showed that these factors play an important role in improving nurses' safety behaviors and preventing musculoskeletal injuries:

- Organizational safety culture
- Availability of lift equipment (particularly ceiling lifts)
- Psychosocial factors (such as job stress)
