THE OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH INTERNSHIP PROGRAM (OHIP)

- Funded by the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), OHIP is a paid summer internship helping young people learn about the field of occupational safety and health from workers and their employers.
- OHIP trains a future specialized workforce of medical and safety professionals who will go on to additional training and may devote careers to making America's workplaces run more efficiently and safely.

OHIP PROJECT EXAMPLES

- Interviewing caregivers at residential facilities to help improve working conditions
- Reducing exposures to chemicals for maintenance workers
- Ensuring access to the right protective gear for workers in sawmills and construction jobs
- Helping standardize engineering controls by working with employers and contractors
